DELIVERING FOR OUR COMMUNITY

Macquarie Fields Station accessibility upgrade.

A long and hard-fought campaign for lifts at Macquarie Fields Station is a major win for our community.

Since I was first elected in 2015, I have worked closely with our community to fight for our fair share of vital infrastructure.

After only one year, the NSW Labor Government is getting on with the job of delivering for our community.

I am delighted that works on the station upgrade are due to start later this year, subject to planning approval.

It comes after years of advocacy from myself, our community, and the Federal Member for Werriwa, Anne Stanley MP.

The lifts will make the station inclusive for all: for people with disability, people with prams or luggage, older people and people with mobility issues. For the first time in 136 years, Macquarie Fields Station will be fully wheelchair accessible.

The long overdue station upgrade will be welcomed by our community, who have told me of their ongoing struggles of dealing with 70 stairs.



People have shared their frustration at having to travel to Ingleburn or Glenfield to catch a train, adding time and cost to their journey.

Our community was ignored and overlooked for too long. A 2019 Auditor-General's report slammed the former Liberal Government's politicisation of station upgrades that prioritised stations with a lower-ranked need than Macquarie Fields.

The NSW Labor Government is restoring fairness and integrity to station upgrades.

It is time for our fair share.

NEW LOCAL PRESCHOOLS

Curran Public School and Sackville Street Public School are among 100 new public preschools announced by the NSW Labor Government.

Co-located at public primary school sites, the new public preschools will be built over the next three years in areas of greatest need across NSW.

The public preschools will improve access to early childhood education for families across NSW.

INFRASTRUCTURE DELIVERY WELCOME

MACQUARIE FIELDS STATION

The NSW Labor Government is improving accessibility and safety at Macquarie Fields Station.

More than 10,000 trips are taken through Macquarie Fields Station every week. The community is home to 2,000 people aged over 60.

The upgrade is being delivered as part of the Safe Accessible Transport program. The program aims to make public transport hubs more accessible, safe and inclusive.

The 2023-2024 NSW Budget allocated a total of \$800.7m over four years to implement the new program, which combines the funds of both the existing Transport Access Program (TAP) and Commuter Car Park Program (CCP) and includes an additional \$300m

Key Features

- A new passenger footbridge, connected by lifts and stairs with increased canopy coverage to the platforms and enhanced platform access from Railway Parade.
- Accessible parking spaces, accessible kiss and ride spaces, additional bike parking and a relocated bus stop on Railway Parade.
- Upgraded station forecourt and greater pedestrian connections to the station, including a new pedestrian crossing in front of the station entrance.
 - A new family accessible toilet and a new ambulant toilet.
- Safety and security will be enhanced through improved lighting, CCTV, and wayfinding signage.

MORE PARKING FOR EDMONDSON PARK

It seems like a distant memory but those who remember Edmondson Park pre-Covid will recall the commuter car parking crisis that was a daily occurrence.

A conga-line of cars around the station precinct. People would park their cars illegally on footpaths and risk a fine just to catch a train to work or for other activities.

Fast forward a few years. Our consistent community campaign for our fair share has been successful in delivering more essential commuter car parking. A win for our community after a long campaign by myself and Anne Stanley MP.

Innovation and sustainability features of the new project include:

- More than 8400 cubic metres of concrete and 1700 tonnes of reinforced steel
- New carbon injected concrete in the footpaths, a landmark trial for the future.
- Over 800 rooftop solar panels to help power the building.
- 10 electric vehicle charging stations.
- A rainwater capture system to water the car park's landscape.

HOW LONG HAVE YOU LIVED IN MACQUARIE FIELDS?

We moved to Macquarie Fields in November 1989 from Narwee. We had family in Macquarie Fields and both worked in Western Sydney. The local area has gone through many changes. When we first moved to the area, there were few amenities and shops. Now, we are spoiled for choice. We love the convenience of having everything close by, and the fantastic sense of community. We feel connected to services, people and community. It's a great place to live.

TELL ME ABOUT YOUR INVOLVEMENT IN THE COMMUNITY.

Keith and I are avid walkers. We are longterm members of an over 50s exercise group run at the Campbelltown PCYC in Minto.

We are also members of a local walking group, Campbelltown Caterpillars. The group holds walks every second Monday and both Keith and I have led walks all over Sydney. There are around 20 members of the group. We enjoy both the physical and social aspects of a walking group. So long as we have our health, we'll continue to keep active and doing our walks.

Many years ago, I joined the Older Women's Network which has a long history in the Campbelltown area. Through this group, we campaigned for an end to violence against women, lobbied for women's rights and held seminars at Parliament House.

Keith and I are also active members of Probus and we enjoy the social gatherings and meeting new people.

WHAT DOES THE UPGRADE OF MACQUARIE FIELDS STATION MEAN TO YOU?

Like everyone, we are very excited and look forward to the accessibility upgrade. It's an amazing win for the local community and has taken many years of advocacy from the community and the local members Anoulack Chanthivong MP and Anne Stanley MP.

People in Macquarie Fields have been waiting a long time for this upgrade. Keith and I are both getting older, so the stairs are getting harder to climb. Sometimes when we're not up to it, we bypass Macquarie Fields Station altogether and travel to Ingleburn or Glenfield to catch a train.

Lifts at the station will change people's lives. It will make public transport inclusive and safe for people with disability, people with prams or luggage, older people like us, and others who may be experiencing mobility problems. We're grateful to Anoulack and Anne for continuing to fight for our fair share. It is an important milestone for Macquarie Fields. The community can't wait to see this important infrastructure project finally delivered! We look forward to works starting.

WHAT DO YOU HOPE FOR THE FUTURE OF MACQUARIE FIELDS?

As keen walkers and nature lovers, it is our hope that our beautiful natural reserves are preserved and protected. Our area continues to grow, and it is places like the bushland around Casula, the creek at the back of our place or improvements to Milton Park that provide good quality of life. Our open spaces enable people to enjoy the physical and mental health benefits of pature.
