New high school takes shape in Edmondson Park



Progress is well underway on a new high school for Edmondson Park.

A topping out ceremony was held in September to mark the next significant milestone in the delivery of the new Edmondson Park High School, with the building's structural phase now complete.

The new high school, located adjacent to Edmondson Park Public School, will include 37 modern classrooms, three support learning classrooms, and a range of world-

class education facilities including science, technology, performing arts, and fitness hubs, a library, canteen, sports field and multi-sports courts and lecture theatre.

Edmondson Park High School will accommodate up to 800 students and include fit-for-purpose classrooms and core facilities to meet enrolment demand and support our area's growing population.

The project is on track for completion by Day 1, Term 1, 2027.

The new school will mean more opportunities for local students, reduced travel time and access to modern facilities. I look forward to the first intake of students in 2027.

As part of the NSW Government's plan to rebuild public education, the 2025-26 Budget is delivering \$3.9 billion for new and upgraded schools in Western Sydney. This targeted investment will ensure growing communities get access to a world-class public education.

Glenfield House gives older

homeless women hope

A partnership initiative launched in September is providing much-needed accommodation for homeless older women in our community.

The launch of Glenfield House is a partnership between the NSW Government, Whiddon Group in Glenfield, Women's Community Shelters, Hume Housing, Urban Property and Housing All Australians to support some of our most vulnerable community members.

The initiative was made possible thanks to a \$446,450 grant under the NSW Government's new Homelessness Innovation Fund to Women's Community Shelters for the establishment of transitional 'meanwhile use' semi-self-contained accommodation for women aged over 55 experiencing homelessness.

The project showcases the repurposing of an old vacant aged care building owned by the Whiddon Group for transitional housing. Glenfield House can accommodate up to 28 women facing homelessness per night.

It is fantastic to see the NSW Government working with a broad range of partners to deliver improved services for homeless

women in the Macquarie Fields electorate.

Census data has indicated older women have been the fastest growing demographic at risk of or experiencing homelessness since 2011.

No one should have to choose between

their safety and their home, which is why projects like Glenfield House - which provide dignity, stability and compassion are so important.

I welcome this addition to our community, which will provide real, meaningful support to women across our local area.



Station upgrade makes progress

Work is progressing at Macquarie Fields Station, with a recent burst of behind-the-scenes progress in mid-September when the station was closed during a period of trackwork.

Concrete foundations have been laid, a new electrical transformer has been installed which will power the station and the new lifts, and old canopies have been removed to make way for the new entry way and lifts.

The school has been working with the Georges River Environmental Education Centre to offer environmental education activities for its students, and this has resulted in some fabulous outcomes. Ajuga School supports students with a complex trauma background and/or autism.

Ajuga School is one of only 24 schools in Australia to receive the internationally recognised Eco-Schools Green Flag award, which is an outstanding achievement.

The school's sustainability program and

Green Guardians initiative is one of many programs the school has created to support its students at school, leading to higher rates of engagement.

Ajuga School is also excited about its upcoming Tiny Forest project. Ajuga will be one - possibly the first - school that Earthwatch has approved for this project.

RENTAL REFORMS



Pembroke Park upgrade

Work has started on an upgrade of the district recreational space, Pembroke Park in Minto.

The \$485,000 upgrade is funded by Campbelltown City Council, with a contribution from the State Government through the Community Building Partnership grant program.

The project will further enhance the recreational space, providing a new playground and shade sail, flying fox, outdoor exercise equipment and landscaping. This will complement the existing climbing net.

The popular park is set in a natural bushland setting, and has barbecue facilities and picnic tables.

The upgrade will mean more local families can enjoy our open spaces for connection and recreational opportunities.

Principal of Bangla School Inc Bardia, Milie is highly respected in the community and has been involved in various community activities to promote literacy, cultural heritage and women's empowerment.



TELL ME MORE ABOUT YOUR COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT.

I have been serving our community alongside my husband, Rafiq, for the past 15 years.

Seeing a need in the community, my husband and I established Bangla School Inc Bardia in 2021, where I serve as Principal and he is the President. Prior to this, I taught at the Campbelltown Bangla School for eight years. Throughout this journey, my husband has always supported and encouraged my involvement in various community work. Unfortunately, he is currently unwell and in hospital, and I deeply miss having him by my side as we continue this work together. He is also respected and admired for his contributions and achievements in the community.

WHY IS THE BANGLA SCHOOL IMPORTANT TO VOIL2

The Bangla School connects me to my heritage and allows me to share our language, traditions, and customs with the next generation.

Our history reminds us of the sacrifices made to preserve our language, and my involvement in the Bangla School is about ensuring it continues for future generations.

I am proud of our students, teachers, and committee, and especially grateful for the ongoing support of parents who continue to bring their children to school. The school is not only about strengthening language, it is also about fostering cultural pride and community spirit.

HAVE YOU BEEN RECOGNISED FOR YOUR WORK AND CONTRIBUTIONS TO OUR LOCAL AREA?

Yes. I am proud to say that I was a finalist in the Campbelltown Citizen of the Year 2021, which was an incredible honour.

YOU FEATURED IN A DOCUMENTARY PROJECT ORGANISED BY MULTICULTURAL NSW.

That is correct. Our school was fortunate to participate in a documentary project organised by the Association of Community Language Schools (ACLS) and funded by Multicultural NSW. The project, which is currently in production, highlights the vital role of community language schools across our state. Our school was selected because of its significant contributions in promoting multiculturalism and fostering community harmony.

It is good to be involved, help others and contribute in any positive way. Some of my involvement includes the annual Cancer Council fundraising event, raising awareness of domestic and family violence, recognition by Fagun Hawa Inc.
